Retractor Deaver 1in, 13in

Common Uses:

Cholecystectomy, Vagotomy, and in cases of repair of duodenal ulcer perforation

Properties:

- Flat Curved Blade
- Atraumatic Working Surface
- Ergonomic Flat Handle

Variations:

- Standard handle
- Ring Grip Handle

Function:

The retractor has smoothed edges to reduce the trauma to the tissue being held in place. A Deaver retractor is generally used for deep abdominal and chest surgeries.

Did you know?



The earliest recorded use of a retractor dates back to the seventh century. The modern retractor is designed after a model developed in 1936 (It is named after the American surgeon John B. Deaver.
